Built in 1961 for WA Howell (the third boat built for him by Bates) and named after his daughter Deirdre Louise. The original purchase price of £6071 plus £67 for teak decking.

Only a few of the distinctive Star Craft fleet were ever constructed with an aft cockpit, the majority of these being the smaller 30ft model. It is believed that only two were ever constructed in the larger 33ft size. Tradition has it that the sister ship to Belle Epoque was irreparably damaged during craning, rendering her now the sole surviving example.
