## History

	There were only five 20' Star Craft built. This one was one of 2 sports versions hence the Chrysler Crown engines. The engine previously fitted in <a href="#">TANTALUS</a> , formally <a href="#">CANOPUS STAR</a> , one of the Bates hire fleet.
	She was built for Lord Montague of Beaulieu, and on completion was exhibited at the 3rd National Boat Show at Olympia.
	Named <a href="#">CYGNET</a> from new. Purchased by M Loynes from P Freebody (boat builders)
December 1999	Purchased by Mervyn Loynes and renamed <a href="#">CYGNET STAR</a>
