

Autumn has arrived, summer is over we have to get back to work, the boat has been waiting for too long now !!!

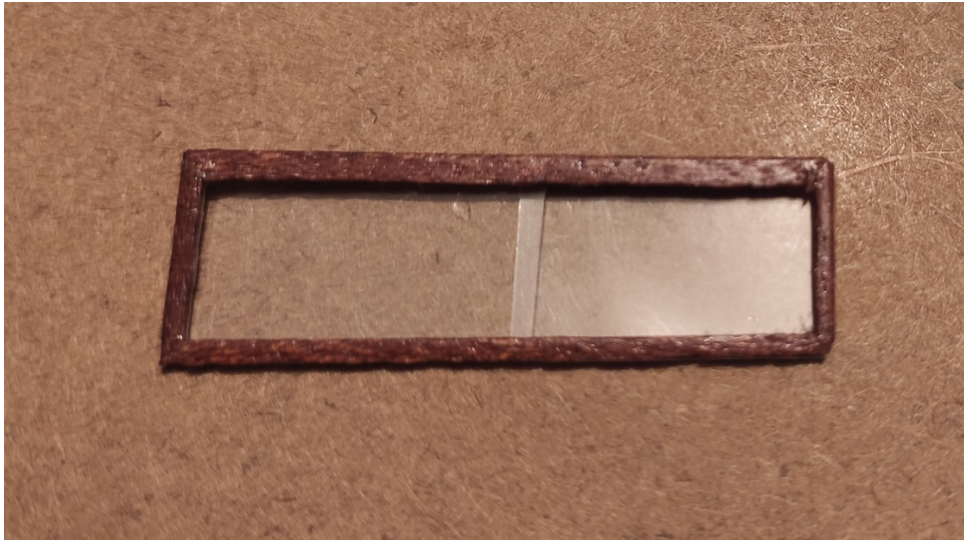
Now it's time for the sliding dinette window which, seen from the inside, has a wooden frame and a chrome handle. For the moment I leave out the sunshade that in these photos can be seen rolled up at the top.



I begin to make the rectangular frame ...



... in which I insert two slightly overlapping plexiglass strips



The microscopic handle is made with a small piece of styrene and chromed with the usual Molotow marker. Then I glue the window to the superstructure.



Now, always using plexiglass, I make the other windows, the one in correspondence with the driver's seat and those of the cabins towards the bow.
At this point it is time to glue the superstructure to the hull, in order to proceed with the other parts of the boat.

Here is an overview.

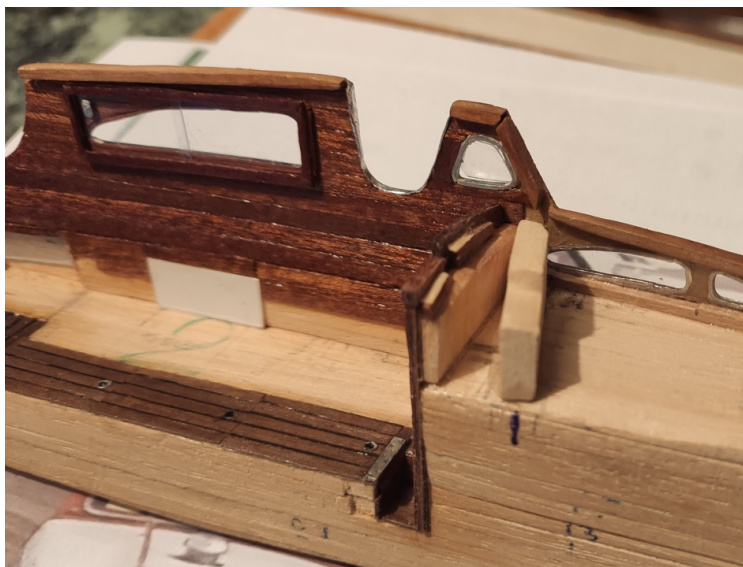




I build the dashboard with the compartment above the cabin door



I must first put some support, which will later also be used for the windshield.
So I use shaped and tailored wood scraps.



For the bottom I use a sheet of Decoflex beech wood while for the edges, slightly raised above the bottom, I use mahogany strips.

For now I have only wiped the linseed oil but then I will give the transparent glossy varnish.
