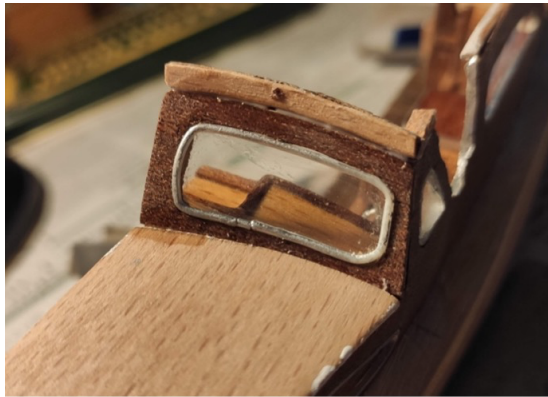


The work continues slowly but steadily!

On the stern and bow side of the dinette I insert the supports for the cover of the deckhouse.

On the bow side I put a riser above the windshield. For the external part I use the Decoflex beech as it will then be painted white. For the inside, I use the Decoflex mahogany because it will be visible.



For the stern side I use the Decoflex mahogany for the external part and a shaped linden strip for the internal part.



I then paint the internal parts towards the dinette with glossy white Humbrol enamel.



Using a cardboard template, I obtain from a 3x2mm linden strip the ribs suitably shaped so as to follow the curvature of the roof of the deckhouse.



Which I then glue into place



Taking the piece of Decoflex that had been cut out previously, I build the rise which in the real hull is slightly raised compared to the cover. This component also has ribs on the inside.

Once I've checked that everything fits together, I'll let the glue dry thoroughly and then I'll do the finishing touches so that the cover fits well to the sides of the deckhouse.
