

The writing on the transom was left open. They handed me the white decal sheet so I printed the name of the boat including the wood between the letters because otherwise these would not show up when applied to the real wood. The color difference between the real wood and the printed one is minimal, to the naked eye it is much less noticeable than in the photograph, so that's okay.



And it's time to give the boat the final look!

I put in place all the accessories with cyanoacrylate glue to have a stronger fixing given the very small dimensions of the pieces to be applied.

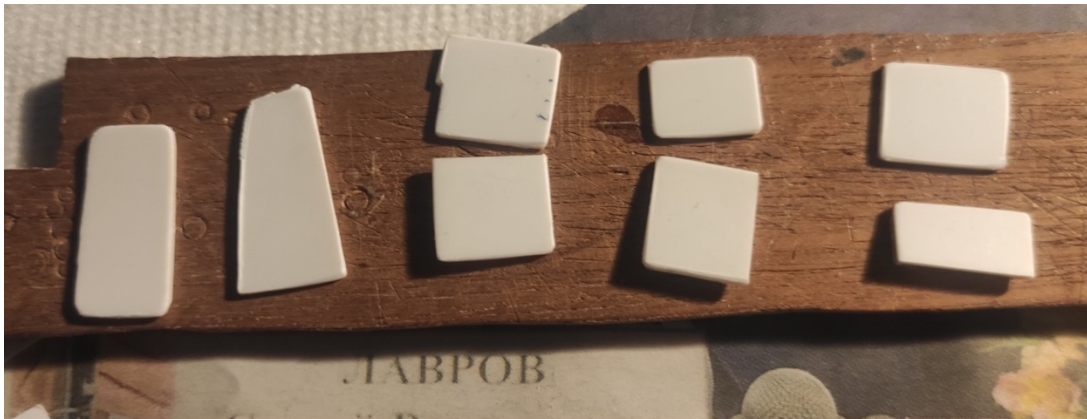

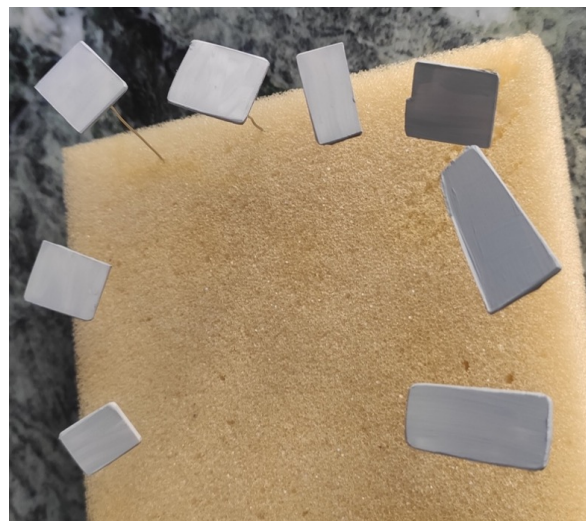




The seat cushions certainly could not be missing to give a more real look to the whole. I made them using 1mm styrene, then suitably shaped to follow the form of the seats and backs.



Then I colored them gray with acrylic paint and I passed a light coat of satin clear.



Here they are in their place. Perhaps they look a little stiff compared to the originals but I'm happy with that.
I would say that now the hull is really complete.
