History

1964	Built for a Mr & Mrs Day of London and named LA LANZADERA originally. At some later time she may have been named EUREKA , and later, WAYWARD WENCH .	
Circa 1967	Sold to Derek H Thomas, a Chartered accountant. Jan 2018 – News from Mike Thomas (Derek’s son): “My father, bought this boat around 1967 and kept it to 1975. The boat was Thames based.... She still had the 2 Chrysler engines at that time, smooth but suffered from sticking valves.”	
Circa 1978	Mr I A Graham of Carter Pegg Ltd of Croyden.	
1980	Sold to Mr Hallam, who passed her on to Barry Andrews of Barnes. Jan 2018 - News from Mike Thomas (Derek Thomas’ son): “Barry Andrews renamed the boat Wayward Wench and restored her after previous neglect.”	
1996	Now owned by a Mr McCann who has returned her name to the original.	
June 2021	News from Mike Thomas that LA LANZADERA is up for sale at Maiden Marine in Windermere for £5k. She is now a restoration project and perhaps could be purchased for much less.	
June 2021	Lynn Atkin and Graham Meyer of AMOREENA have bought her and she will be restored at Dennett’s yard on the Thames. She will be renamed WAYWARD WENCH in due course.
