	the Thames & Kennet. Carpe Diem is Latin for "Seize the Day".		
	Subsequently owned by Neil & Mercedes Durman.		
Aug 1998	Purchased by Mervyn and Diane Loynes. Engine replaced. ENGINE No 7302 -		
	propeller 15in diameter x 12in pitch.		
2001	Reverted to the name she had for more than 30 years "Misty Lady" for year		
	2001 licence.		
2003	Purchased by Chris Rose of London.		
2007	Restored by Stanley & Thomas (see photo). Believed to have gone to a new		
	home on Ullswater in the Lake District.
