We then moved her to where she is now, Penton Hook Marina, Chertsey. I did my apprenticeship at Bates from 1961 so have worked on all the Starcraft after that date. I decided to restore one myself so have been working on Musidora whilst carrying on my boatbuilding business so it has been a slow process.
